## HISTORY: ISM TO UWC

Founded in 1969, School Moshi (ISM) became the first school in Africa to offer the IB Diploma. In 2019 we officially joined the UWC Movement representing the second UWC institution in the African continent.

## DELIBERATE DIVERSITY

Our community includes boarding and day students, Tanzanian nationals, and international students. Local and international educators and staff from diverse backgrounds enrich this vibrant environment, enhancing all aspects of life at UWC East Africa, from classrooms to boarding.

## RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Both campuses of UWC East Africa offer residential components. Residential life at UWC East Africa fosters student leadership and a strong sense of community. 80% of the students live on campus and 20% are day students in the Diploma Program.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

Unlike 14 of the other 18 UWCs, UWCEA is an IB World School. Thus, 30% of our students come up through the Primary Years and Middle Years Programs, while 70% come through the highly selective National Committee process.

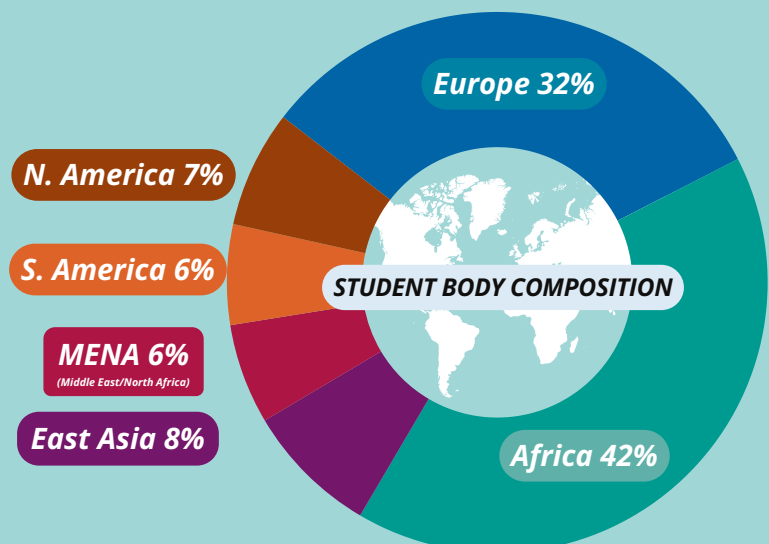
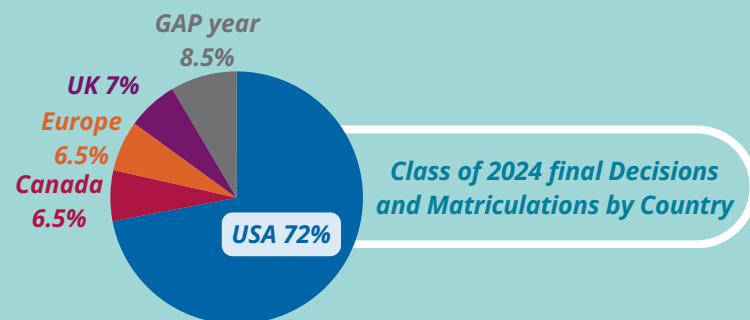

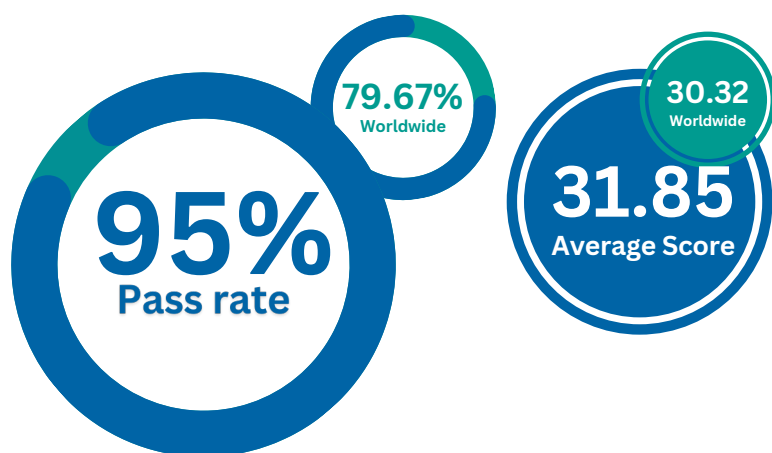

- IBDP Anticipated Grades are calculated if required for admission in December and IBDP Predicted Grades in March of the second year.

## CURRICULUM

UWC East Africa is an IB World School offering the Primary Years (PYP), Middle Years (MYP), and Diploma Program (DP) to students ages 3-20.

Our students graduate with an accredited high school diploma recognized by the Council of International Schools (CIS) and the Middle States Association (MSA).

While many of our students complete the full International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), others choose to pursue individual IB certificates.

## SCHOOL YEAR

Our school year is comprised of two semesters. Reporting for all students is at the end of Quarters two and four. D2 students receive second semester reports in April with IB examination results reported in the first week of July.

## OUTDOORS & SPORTS

Embracing Tanzania's vibrant outdoor culture, students participate year-round in organized and extramural sports, competing in the Northern Tanzanian Schools Athletic Associations in sports like soccer, rugby, volleyball, basketball, athletics, and swimming.

Our Outdoor Pursuits (OP) program takes full advantage of Tanzania's stunning landscapes, offering a structured program across four domains. Each domain features four levels of progression, ensuring that students are continually challenged and engaged.

- **Reefs:** Explore marine ecosystems through snorkeling, diving, and coastal studies.
- **Plains:** Discover wildlife and conservation on safaris and nature walks in Tanzania's savannahs.
- **Peaks:** Challenge yourself with mountain treks, including summiting Kilimanjaro.
- **Rides:** Build endurance and navigation skills through cycling across diverse terrains.
- **Mindfulness:** Engage in contemplative practices during retreats to promote holistic well-being and reconnect with your inner self.

UWC EA ensures access by offering one free trip for all students and leadership roles opportunities.

## MISSION IN ACTION

Our students are committed not only to academics but also to **connecting and contributing** to the local community. They engage in student-designed weekly, semester, and year-long community service projects, and participate in club activities where they explore their talents, passions, and creativity.

Connecting knowledge to real-world experiences, **Week Without Walls** (in MYP) and **Project Week** (in DP) extend learning beyond the classroom, providing opportunities for students to lead experiential activities outside campus that foster environmental awareness, service, and personal growth.

During the 2023-2024 academic year, **four teams** of UWC East Africa students won \$2000 grants to put their impactful community projects into action.
